

Stan Sutliff Memorial Tournament

5th Annual Stan Sutliff Memorial Tournament Guidelines and Rules

Anglers are responsible for:


- Arrive early enough to allow adequate time to set up!
- Providing all equipment, bait, and tackle required to participate in the event.
- Having all appropriate licenses, passes/stickers, parking fees/permits, and observing/knowing all applicable fishing regulations, size limits, and published VBAC rules.
- All participants registered for the Stan Sutliff Memorial Tournament assume all risks while fishing or volunteering for the event and will not hold the Virginia Beach Anglers Club liable for injury or otherwise.

Anglers shall follow these rules:

- The Stan Sutliff Memorial Tournament is an Individual Tournament. Scores will be kept individually.
- Tournament anglers are required to be affiliated with one of the participating south-side anglers clubs to include: Tidewater Anglers Club, Great Bridge Fisherman's Association, Norfolk Anglers Club and/or the Virginia Beach Anglers Club.
- Anglers who do not register by the deadline are not guaranteed entry to the tournament.
 Early registration ensures that there is enough fishing space, judges and food for competitors.
- At no time shall any angler have more than one line in the water.
- Float rigs, balloons, plastic bags, etc. will not be allowed. No cast nets may be used during a fishing session. Chumming or chum pots at any time are not permitted. Anglers doing so will be disqualified.
- Not more than two hooks are allowed on one line at any time apart from two double hooked rigs, and artificial lures with hooks according to manufacturer's specifications.
- All tournament fish must be caught on hook or lure and landed on the beach by the angler.
- No lines are permitted to be in the water prior to starting time. All lines must be reeled in at the stopping time. Any fish hooked prior to end of the session will be scored when landed.
- It is the angler's responsibility to fish within the boundaries of the designated fishing area.
- If an angler is unable to physically cast for themselves, a designated casting person must be identified in writing before fishing begins.

Stan Sutliff Memorial Tournament

- The winner of the event is determined by total points scored. First tiebreaker is total number of fish caught. Second tiebreaker is largest fish caught. If still tied, a winner will be determined by the flip of a coin by the Chief Judge.
- A paying division or placement that does not have a winner will not be awarded to an angler.
- No submission accepted after 1:00.
- All submitted photos must be taken with nose of fish against the end of the measuring device and numbered token issued at check-in clearly visible.
- Please make sure photo and measurement is clear.
- Fish submitted will be rounded off to the nearest quarter inch.
- Judge will text confirmation of receipt and size noted.
- All ties will be decided by earliest entry.
- Judges' decision is final.
- All submissions are submitted via smartphone by text to Judge at 267-994-7423.

Waterman Wins the 22nd Annual Virginia Beach Billfish Tournament Scoring 33 White Marlin Releases

(Virginia Beach, VA); Without question, the 22nd Annual Virginia Beach Billfish Tournament was a resounding success. Despite a near-miss from a major hurricane and a delayed start, the 39 teams competing put on an absolute angling showcase. In two days of fishing the smaller fleet released 420 billfish, including 409 white marlin, eight blue marlin, two sailfish and a spearfish. In the end, *Waterman*, a local 70 Ricky Scarborough owned by VBBT Board Member Mike Standing, triumphed with 33 whites on its ledger, worth 2,310 points. The team, guided by Capt. Ben Horning, was the top boat both days.

With the win, *Waterman* earned \$298,500. The winning categories included Top VBBT Boat and multiple first-place daily/tournament jackpots and trophies. In addition to Standing and Horning, the team consisted of Tom Baer, Garrett Holden, Antonio (Tony) Huerta, Jason Votzi, Jack Bobbitt and Aaron Horning. *Waterman* also took home the top tuna prize of \$9,750 (74.1 pounds/Tony Huerta).

Don t Panic, a 64 Viking run by Capt. Bryan Peele, made a hard charge up the leaderboard, including 19 whites on Sunday, to finish with 26 releases overall (1,820 points). *Don t Panic* is pocketing \$55,575 for its efforts, including second place boat overall and jackpots. Andrew Norris is the boat's owner.

Capt. Colin Oxnard and his team on *Fender Bender*, a 62 Spencer Yacht based in Manteo, was the third-place finisher with 22 fish and 1,540 points. *Fender Bender* won \$66,525 as the third-place boat, plus jackpots. The team also won second-place in the Legacy Jackpot and first-place in the Day 2 Charity Mystery Fish drawing.

Outnumbered (65 Viking/Capt. James Breen) earned 1,540 points for 22 releases based on time for fourth place overall, while *Griffin* (65 Rybovich/Capt. John Adams) earned fifth-place recognition by releasing 19 fish for 1,330 points. *Griffin* scored a \$8,775 payout based on a second-place daily jackpot. *Outnumbered* also won \$5,000 for the Wayne Sawyer Victory Lap Hard Charger Award.

In the individual awards categories, William (Wayne) Enroughty Jr. boated the top dolphin at 25.6 pounds, good for a \$9,750 purse. He was fishing aboard *Sniper* (58 Paul Mann/Capt. Chris Raiford). Whitney Simmons, competing on *Sea Toy* (59 Spencer/Capt. Bull Tolson) was named the Top Lady Angler with 10 marlin releases to her credit. Fifteen-year-old Sutton Paul (The Kid) is taking home the Bryan "Pick" Dalheim Memorial Trophy as the top junior angler after scoring a white marlin release. Paul was competing on *Sea Escape* (53 RG Boatworks/Capt. Kevin Paul).

"It's been a wild, crazy week but we finished with a flurry," Tournament Director Paula Davis said after Sunday's awards presentations. "I'd like to thank the 39 teams for sticking with us and putting on a show, our wonderful and generous sponsors, and all our hard-working staff and volunteers for going above and beyond. We couldn't have pulled this off without all of you. But let me go on record right now. For next year, I'm pre-ordering bluebird skies, fair winds and following seas."

The 23rd Annual Virginia Beach Billfish Tournament is set for August 19-22, 2026.

Out of an 88-boat field, his group aboard the *Drifter*, a charter out of Nags Head, finished 4th and placed in the money. Geoff caught a sailfish and a blue marlin, which beats my best efforts. The *Drifter* was in first on day 2 most of day, knocking *Catch23* (Michael Jordan's boat) out of first. But with few minutes to go, they themselves got knocked down. On Friday, with only a bit left of day the *Drifter* hooked 3 sailfish, my son being one of the anglers. His comment to mom was "what a rush".

Final results were *Deep Color* 1rst, *Marsh Madness* 2nd, *Catch23* 3rd, *Drifter* 4th, and *Waterman* (Mike Standing) 5th.

- Prize Fish Committee before the regular business meeting begins, following the month the fish was caught. To be eligible for the annual awards, all entries must be submitted no later than the second meeting following the catch. Catches made in December must be turned in by the following January meeting to be eligible for the previous year's awards.
- The contest is free and open to all members in good standing whose dues have been paid before the catch, according to the club bylaws. There is no entry fee to participate.
- The territorial limits for the contest shall be the waters of Virginia and North Carolina and their coasts.
- To be accepted for entry, fish must be taken on hook and line and must follow all recreational fishing regulations as determined by the state to which it was caught. Only fish caught in waters open to public fishing may be submitted for entry to the Prize Fish Committee.
- To qualify for entry as a catch, all fish must be weighed on certified scales.
- In order to qualify for a club record, the fish must be weighed at an official state weigh station.
- Weights should be converted to pounds and ounces. A witness must be present and must sign the form. If the fish qualifies for a VA or NC state tournament citation, that receipt will meet these requirements.
- Entries in the monthly contest must meet "minimum club weight requirements" and will be considered for the annual contest. Minimum acceptable weights and lengths are set by the Prize Fish Committee and approved by the Board of Directors.
- Acceptability of entries will be at the discretion of the Prize Fish Committee whose decision will be final.
- In the case of a tie in the catch category, length, then girth will be used to determine the winner.
