

On the evening of October 10th, I received a call about a big Darwin's Slimehead that had just arrived at the dock at The Virginia Beach Fishing Center. The existing IGFA All Tackle Slimehead was the fish I weighed for Ron Van Kirk in 2008, which weighed 7.5-pounds. The word was that this fish weighed over 8-pounds! So I hopped in my truck and met the angler and his crew at the Fishing Center. They were all very excited. The slimehead tipped the scale at 8-pounds, 5-ounces, so I proceeded with the photos, measurements, and paperwork.

Kevin Wong of Virginia Beach and his crew had just returned from an overnight trip of trolling and deep dropping aboard the Wave Runner, skippered by Michael Meridith. The Darwin's Slimehead hit squid offered in over 200 fathoms of water near the Norfolk Canyon. Kevin reeled for nearly 20 minutes, when the fish finally popped up on the surface, and his buddy swung the fish onboard, but no one knew what it was. Kevin decided that after such a workout for a useless fish, he was done reeling and opted to relax for the remainder of the trip. Little did he know his useless fish was a new pending world record!

Another outstanding catch from Virginia waters. Congratulations to the angler, captain, and crew!


Surf Fishing Report

With 2 of the 3 fall surf fishing tournaments already completed, I wanted to update the club on how we have fared so far. The long and short of it is that we have had some pretty rough tournaments. Hatteras Village in September was the first. The club sponsors 2 teams in this tournament and we did a fair job in this one. The "A" team finished in tenth place out of 78 teams and the "B" team finished in 17th place. The "B" team was in third place at the end of the first day but flat beaches and no fish caused the fall to 17th.

The Nags Head tournament was in October and the team finished tied with several other teams for 60th place out of 80 teams. The water had not quite cleared from the recent storms on Thursday and the weather was almost too pretty for surf fishing. The water was clearer on Friday but the fishing was still slow unless you were in the right site. The winning team fished a site on Friday afternoon that our team fished on Thursday afternoon. We threw everything we had at that site because there was a nice break in the bar in the middle of the site and it just looked fishy. We caught one shark about $3\frac{1}{2}$ feet long, some small black drum and other little stuff. The winning team caught 70 fish for 139 points there Friday Afternoon. In this case we were a day early instead of a day late.

The third tournament is the Cape Hatteras Angler's Club tournament in November. Wish the best for Julie Ball, Steve Wray, George Schuchman, Carl McCoy, Russell Willoughby, and Robbie Parks, our team for that one.

On a local note, I hear from a reliable source that as of October 15th there are still some drum at Sandbridge as well as blue fish, round heads and other surf stuff. The stripers should be around the Lesner Bridge soon if not already, so don't put the long rods away just yet! The weather is still great for being on the beach so go give it a try!



Inspired by last month's speaker, Al Bunnel, and armed with Al's expert advice, club member Kevin Meyer set out to test the expert.

Friday night Oct 8th the weather was just too nice to stay inside and Rachel and I decided to go fishing. I had attended the club meeting Thursday evening and listened to AL Bunnel talk about tips and tactics for catching Puppy Drum and he even provided some tips and locations for catching the big reds when they move out of the bay. I figured we would give the Puppy Drum a shot on this trip even though the reports were not encouraging. We trailered over to Owl Creek and launched the boat around 6 pm and went out in search of bait.

Rachel manned the cast net and proceeded to catch about 30 shrimp in the net on the first throw!! (Many of them were 2 inches or bigger) we had seen some large schools of mullet swimming nearby and she was able to get some really nice mullet in just a few throws. With our bait caught we decided to head to one of our most productive fishing holes and we setup in about 16 feet of water casting to grass bank on a point.

The tide was still coming in and the fishing was slow to start off, as the sun went down and the tide changed I had a very large fish on and about 2 minutes into the fight the line broke...Bummer!! I checked the line and it was scuffed up pretty good and I guess the Oyster shells won that round. The tide has now changed and we relocated the boat to get into a better casting position and as I'm putting the first line out the rod was nearly torn from my hand and the fish took off like a rocket and was tail-walking across the water like a sailfish!! It was a really nice fish and I wanted to get it to the boat but it had other ideas and was on the run into the oyster bed....this too was a short fight and the oysters claimed another victory. (Now I'm looking forward to the OYSTER ROAST to get some payback!!!)

I reset out 3 lines and in short turn 2 of them go off at the same time and now Rachel and I are both hooked up with fish and proceed to get them both to the boat. Rachel had a 18.5 inch Pup that had 12 Spots and I had a 17.95 inch that just wouldn't measure so back he goes. With one fish now in the box it was looking up. We had a couple of 16 and 17 inch fish up next but not big enough. we seen some very large schools of mullet come through and something was chasing them. I casted back into the school and immediately hooked up a nice one that took off to deep water, as I'm fighting this fish, Rachel has another one on and gets it to the boat and as I'm lifting mine into the boat if came off. I didn't even have time to think about losing the fish as the third rod is now bowed up with a fish I picked it up and got it to the net another 18.5 incher for the box. We stayed or another hour and ended up with 2 in the box for dinner, 4 released to fight another day and 6 that we never got to the net. This was our first Pup trip of the year. We went 6 for 12 on the pups and following some dismal reports from other anglers that the pups were not cooperating it was good to see there are still some around.

Rods: Diawa Millionaire Classic medium-heavy action 6 foot casting rods.

Reels: Diawa Millionare Classic 300 casting reels spooled with 30# Power pro.

Terminal tackle: Fishfinder rigs with 2-3 Feet Bill Fisher 60# leader attached to 6/0 Gamakatsu Circle hooks.

Bait: Grass Shrimp and Cut Mullet.




