2021 VBAC Roulette

Date: Thursday, March 4th, 2021

The roulette fish will be randomly selected at the **March 4th, 2021** membership meeting. In the event the meeting is cancelled, they will be randomly selected at the board meeting. You must declare your entry to the Prize Fish Committee **before** fish selection.

Roulette Information: To promote competitive fishing, the club devised a way to support fishing without providing an unfair advantage to any anglers. The solution involved a wheel that included a variety of freshwater and saltwater species in Virginia. The species are selected at random by spin of the roulette wheel. It costs \$20 for an angler to participate and each species winner receives an equal share of prize money.

Roulette Rules: Any fish caught from 1/1/2021 – 12/31/2021 will qualify. Only the **heaviest** fish in each category will win. Must have contacted the Prize Fish Committee to enter before the wheel is spun. Payment is expected no later than the April 1st, 2020 meeting. You are required to submit your entry via the clubs standard Prize Fish form. Prize Fish/Roulette entries can be submitted in hand or by mail to the Virginia Beach Anglers Club Prize Fish Committee. A table of the current leaders will be kept up to date and posted in each newsletter.

The Offshore Wind Project

Offshore wind is a complex and enormous capital construction domain. Among other requirements, specific ships — jack ships that extends legs to the sea floor and jacks up above the sea for a stable construction platform — are required for the actual putting together of the massive wind turbines at sea. To date, there is no U.S. flagged jack ship that can support construction. The limited projects to date, such as [Dominion's two-turbine project that begin operations earlier this year](#), have used leased European ships. Due to U.S. law, specifically the Jones Act, using non-U.S.-constructed and crewed ships greatly complicates and constrains U.S. offshore wind construction. Dominion, with its accelerating path toward a massive 2.6-gigawatt wind farm off the Virginia coast, announced today that it is investing [\\$600 million](#) to address this bottleneck.

In a press conference earlier today that featured Governor Ralph Northam, Senator Mark Warner, and Dominion's CEO Robert Blue, Dominion Energy announced the keel laying of the first Jones Act-compliant offshore wind turbine installation vessel. Being built by shipbuilding firm [Keppel AmFELS](#) shipbuilders in Brownsville, Texas, this ship [should enter service in 2023](#).

"Today marks a critical step forward in the development of the offshore wind industry in Virginia and across the East Coast." Senator Warner continued, "The construction of the first Jones Act compliant offshore wind turbine installation vessel serves as another vital link in the growing domestic manufacturing supply chain to support offshore wind energy development here in the U.S. This vessel will enable the timely construction of planned offshore wind development projects throughout the East Coast, including the Coastal Virginia Offshore Wind commercial project."

The ship will be based in the Hampton Roads area, potentially with other to be constructed offshore wind support ships and vessels, and serve offshore wind projects along the Atlantic seaboard. Dominion Energy will own and operate the ship to lease it out for offshore wind projects — including to Dominion Energy Virginia.

The Offshore Wind Project - Continued

While serious issues and questions exist about how Virginia is moving forward on offshore wind (pricing, contracting, otherwise) and the overall Dominion Energy power portfolio (including continued efforts to build hard-or-impossible-to-justify gas power generation facilities), this announcement is another milestone event showing an ever-more-serious Dominion's attention to renewable energy as a path to boost its profitability.

Dominion Energy clearly sees the wide-ranging business opportunities that offshore wind represents and, with this announcement, is making serious moves not just towards construction of a Virginia offshore wind project, but towards grabbing a leading position in providing the services to build and maintain U.S. offshore wind projects. If based in the Hampton Roads area, this could well expand the economic and jobs creation benefits that Virginia and Virginians in the coming decade(s) of the just beginning offshore wind project boom.

"Offshore wind is bringing clean energy and new jobs to America, and Virginia is leading the way," said Governor Ralph Northam. "This new vessel will help propel the offshore wind supply chain, drive economic development in Hampton Roads, and grow the offshore wind workforce in our Commonwealth. We are thrilled to celebrate great news like this in what has been a challenging year."

Attention Virginia Black Sea Bass Anglers, the 2021 February recreational black sea bass fishing season will start February 1st and end on February 28th, 2021. We want to remind all anglers that a recreational black sea bass permit is available at <https://webapps.mrc.virginia.gov/public/mpermits/index.php>. It is required for ONLY the captain or operator of the vessel and that it is their responsibility to report all black sea bass caught or released and all trips taken during the 2021 February recreational black sea bass season. A Beautiful Crappie Day in the New Year:

Well, if this first day fishing in the New Year 2021 is any harbinger of the future I will love this year. Went fishing with Russell in Lake Smith/Larsen in my Basstracker V14 since Russell's John boat 9.9 was not working right. It was cold but not freezing with no wind and water temps at 48 degrees. At first stop I had a throwback crappie on before I could get all my lines out. We were fishing shiners under bobbers which is a great visual experience. This started a steady bite that maintained for the rest of the day with my biggest at 13.50 inches, then two 12.75 inch and two 12 inchers all released for club minimums. Meanwhile Russell was also steadily catching fish up to 11 inches that went into the cooler with all the other keeper sized crappie I was catching also going into the cooler. I had one bass also with Russell catching two bass. All were small but active. In total we think we caught over 25 crappie through the day. All in the same place. It doesn't get much better than this.

Another Lake Smith trip but much colder:

Russell and I went to Smith again but it was much colder 41-43 degrees with the lake temp at 44 degrees. We went to the same spot we caught so well at on Tuesday and the sun was out but wind was up to 12 mph so for the first half of the day we could not catch a single fish. But we watched a guy near us catch dozens, mostly small throwback crappie with an occasional keeper. He was using a jig and we were fishing with bobbers and shiners. We tried a couple of other spots to no avail since we really weren't seeing any bait like we did on Tuesday. So we went back to our good spot where we knew fish were and this time tried trolling our baits with my Minn Kota trolling motor and we started catching. Ended up with 8 fish but only two were keepers and Russell got a 12 inch release club minimum from them. Still better than staying at home on a cold day. Russell figures the fish were dormant on the bottom and only hitting baits jigged on the bottom whereas when we came back the water was warmer and the slow troll presented the fish an meal they couldn't pass up. I did get two times a big fish, probably a bass that grabbed my bait and ran through our other lines and got off the hook.

Crappie Fishing 1.11.21,

Russell and I went fishing on Lakes Smith and Larsen on the Monday after a cold wet weekend. While it was windy the temps were nudging 50 degrees so we could not resist an attempt no matter what it proved to be. Water temp was 46 by noon. We started just anchored in our favorite place on Lake Larsen and almost immediately I had a chain pickerel that went tearing all over the place of course tangling lines all up. Once in the boat it measured 19 inches, for a club minimum release. Soon after Russell and I both got a couple of bass that were small but feisty. I then began to catch one crappie after another starting with a 12 inch then a 13 inch which I released in order to make by 6 for expert. But Russell couldn't get to where the fish were biting so we repositioned the boat. In the process of attempting to pull up the front anchor the chain broke cause it was rusted. We couldn't find it so were repositioned then we both started pulling in one after another. Russell ended up with a 13 inch, 12.5 inch and two 12 inch release club minimums. I caught 6 more keeper sized fish up to 12 inch and Russell got 5 more we kept for eating. We must have thrown back another dozen undersized crappie. It was just one of those get catching days that just got better as the day got warmer. Now we both have crappie in the freezer too. We fished with shiners on Bobby Garland soft bodies on jigs. My tube with black head and chartreuse legs was hot. Russell's MoGlo Slab Slay'r green tube body and chartreuse sheath was hot for him. After awhile any color jig worked.
